Emory Pipeline Collaborative (EPiC)

EPiC is a Health Careers Opportunity Program (HCOP) that prepares high school students for college success and entry into health careers. Once accepted, students are expected to actively participate through their high school graduation and respond to alumni check in surveys. The program includes 10 days during the summers after sophomore and junior years.

- Interested in a career in health care
- Commitment to actively participate in 10 after school sessions during Spring Semester AND Summer Institutes before Junior and Senior years.
